



The train, covering the 7.3-kilometer distance from Sagano to Kameoka in 25 minutes, runs along a abandoned JR railway track converted to tourism use. It is a popular attraction year-round, giving passengers leisurely views of nature along the Hozu River Gorge—cherry blossoms in spring, fresh greenery in summer, brilliantly colored autumn foliage, and serene winter landscapes. On the open-sided "Rich" car, passengers can experience the breeze, the light, and the sound of the journey directly.

Sagano Romantic Train

The Sagano Scenic Railway attracts visitors year-round. On its 25-minute journey, this train travels through eight tunnels and crosses bridges giving glimpses of the Hozu River below.

From Kameoka Hozu-gawa **Kyoto** River Boat Ride

Sightseeing boats began appearing on the Hozu River, made navigable by Suminokura Ryoi, a Kyoto merchant, and originally used to transport goods to Kyoto, around 140 years ago. After sightseeing in Kameoka, cruising down the river to Kyoto is a pleasurable experience.

In the Edo period, Kyoto merchant Suminokura Ryoi spent large sums removing huge stones from the swift current of the Hozu River to make water transport possible. The river played an important role in the development of the Tamba region upstream, transporting its timber, rice and charcoal. Nowadays, the river is a tourism asset; a cruise in flat-bottomed boats directed over the rapids by skilled oarsmen traveling through the Hozu Gorge on a 2-hour long voyage. Seeing the hollows in the rocks, which have been created by the pole poking in the same places, gives you a sense of the long history of the river.

Yunohana Onsen Hot Springs



Long a secluded hideaway for Kyotoites, Yunohana Onsen offers proximity to nature, elaborately designed hot spring baths and delicious cuisine.

Set in quiet mountain surroundings 7 kilometers from central Kameoka, Yunohana Onsen has a long history. Legend has it that samurai wounded in battle during the Warring States period came here to heal. Enjoy simple relaxation in this hot spring in a quiet mountain gorge with sparkling clean air and stunning views throughout the four seasons. Here one can remember the past, with visits to sites famed in history and legend such as Myoshuji Temple, Mt. Asahi Jinzoji Temple, Anaoji Temple and Hiedano Jinja Shrine. There are also plenty of opportunities to enjoy the bounty of nature in the form of wild mountain greens in spring, avu sweetfish in summer, matsutake mushrooms in autumn, and boar-meat hotpot accompanied by local sake in winter.

1 Tamba Kameyama Castle Town

Samurai Akechi Mitsuhide began developing the castle town in earnest in 1680. The streetscape features buildings with traditional architectural elements such as Kyo-goushi (Kyoto-style latticework) and Mushiko windows (ultra-fine lattice window), and the names of the castle town such as Konya-machi, Gofuku-machi, and Shioyacho from that period survive even today. The district captures the cultural atmosphere of the time.

3 Tamba Kameyama Castle Ruins

Ruins of Tamba Kameyama Castle, from where Akechi Mitsuhide led an advance to subdue the Tamba region. He supposedly set out from here to assassinate powerful daimyo Oda Nobunaga at Honnoji temple in Kyoto in 1582.

4 Nango Park

Nango Pond (the Zozu River), which forms the outer moat of Tamba Kameyama Castle. Today, it is a park used as a venue for events and a popular spot for viewing cherry blossoms in spring.

5 Sanga Stadium by KYOCERA

This stadium fronting JR Kameoka Station, which can accommodate 21,600 spectators, is Kyoto Prefecture's only dedicated stadium for ball sports. It hosts soccer and other ball sports as well as e-sports and is also equipped for bouldering.

1 Kameoka "Sea of Clouds" Lookout

A prime spot for viewing the Kameoka Valley, often covered in fog from autumn to spring.

2 Kameoka Forest Station

Offering a variety of local products, this facility includes a museum of natural whetstones and a medicinal cuisine restaurant. There are also cottages and campsites, bouldering and a hiking course for visitors who want to enjoy the outdoors.

3 Izumo Daijingu Shrine



Izumo Daijingu, whose shrine rock is believed to have divine power to attract good fortune in love, draws worshippers from all over Japan. The spring water, Manai-no-Mizu, welling from the sacred Mount Mikage and Meotoiwa (pair of rocks representing spouses), where worshippers tie red threads for amulets, are said to help find a good marriage partner. The honden worship hall is designated an important cultural property.

4 Kyoto Tamba/ Kameoka Cosmos Garden

This 4-hectare park is planted with 8 million cosmos, including rare varieties such as the pale Yellow Campus and the showy multi-petaled Saike. The Tamba Ajiwai Market in the park sells local specialties and fresh vegetables for everyone to enjoy. The park hosts a creative scarecrow contest and other special activities and is equipped with a dog run. Visitors can also buy fresh cut flowers here.



BEAUTIFUL GARDEN

Enjoy a relaxing visit amid the scenic beauty of Kameoka in every season.



Bodaisan Anaoji Temple

This Buddhist temple, founded more than 1,300 years ago, is registered as a Japan Heritage site. The temple's main hall houses a reclining figure of Buddha, which, it is said, can relieve aches and pains when the corresponding part of the statue's body is stroked.

Tokonagesan Senjuji Temple

The temple's main gate offers a superb view; in winter, a sea of clouds spreading between the mountains is a magical sight. At this mountain temple, said to have been established by the eminent monk Kukai, people pray for eye diseases to be cured.





Hozu Gorge

The Hozu Gorge, which stretches from near Hozu Bridge in Kameoka to Togetsu Bridge in Arashiyama, is one of the most beautiful in Kyoto prefecture. The gorge's banks were eroded over millennia, and wonderful views of the gorge can be enjoyed both on land and from the water.

EVENTS



Kyoto-Kameoka Balloon Festival

The main event takes place at Hozu River Riverside Park, within walking distance of JR Kameoka Station. Features competition flights among top-rated Japanese hot-air balloon pilots, boarding tethered balloons, and in the evening, a magical Balloon Illusion performance.

Kameoka Mitsuhide Festival

Known for creating the town beneath the castle, warrior general Akechi Mitsuhide (1528–1582), the first lord of Tamba Kameyama Castle, is a popular figure here. The festival, held every year on May 3 to commemorate Mitsuhide, features a warrior parade of mounted samurai and children dressed in miniature armor, who create a colorful spectacle walking through the town.



Hozu River Fireworks

This grand fireworks display takes place in August, upriver from the Hozu Bridge, commemorating victims of war and natural disasters. Spectacular fireworks light up the evening sky. Paid admission only.





Kameoka Festival

On October 24, the eve of the festival, floats are displayed by lantern light and various events take place as the town comes together to celebrate. The festival procession on October 25 features 11 floats which depart from the Hatagomachi district




and parade through the town. The floats' elaborate decorations rival those of Kyoto's famed Gion Festival. They are even described as moving museums.


Kameoka for Food Lovers

Ideal Conditions

The Kameoka valley is often enveloped in the famous Tamba fog. Large temperature fluctuations producing fog and the resultant humidity, together with fertile soil, pure water and heritage technologies combine to produce a bounty of local products. These include heirloom Kyoto vegetables, Tamba's famed black soybeans and Umaji Dainagon azuki beans, chestnuts and matsutake mushrooms. The region is also well known for its beef, chicken and boar, and for river fish such as ayu sweetfish and others.


